- **Find a partner to work with either in the database or if you already know who you want to partner with simply have them register in the database.**

- Please note that even if your program serves boys, so long as you serve girls and aim to promote their participation in STEM fields, your program can still qualify for a mini-grant.

**The current deadline for mini-grant proposals is September of 2010.**
